Significant highlights of 2021:

- Many of our residents have raised the standards for the level of employment and income they have secured.
- We added play therapy in order to go deeper in healing for our residents' children.
- We successfully relaunched our alumni program in order to offer a longer continuum of care for our families.

As we look ahead to 2022, we have so much to be thankful for! Our trauma-informed programs and staff capacity are growing in order to better assist more women and children than ever before. MISSION, PURPOSE & PROGRAM OVERVIEW



MISSION

The Dwelling Place is a Christ-centered ministry providing healing and hope to victims of domestic abuse through supportive services and a safe, transitional place to call home.

PURPOSE

The Dwelling Place exists to break the generational cycle of abuse by equipping and empowering women through the love of Jesus Christ so they can experience lasting freedom.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Dwelling Place has a 24 year history of providing services to victims of domestic abuse. The first tangible step towards providing strength and dignity to women and their children is to provide the safety and stability of a safe place to sleep, a safe place to live, and a safe place to belong.

The Dwelling Place provides transitional housing and case management to help women transition to lives free of abuse. Our trauma-informed program consists of two primary healing principles: safety and empowerment. We were founded on the understanding that, in order to help victims of domestic abuse heal from their emotional wounds, our programs must be Christ-centered and comprehensively designed to address the whole person. We work to help residents become empowered through individualized care plans that recognize and build upon their strengths, as well as provide detailed solution-focused strategies to address their areas for growth and future goals.
